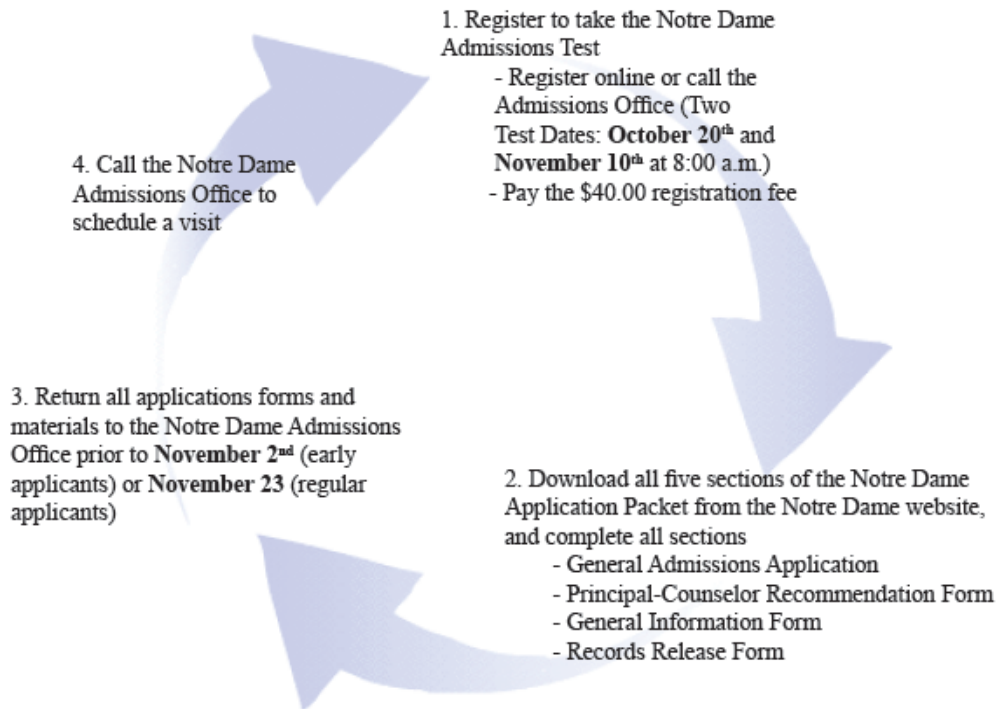

Financial Aid

Parents who submit a financial aid application will automatically be considered for financial assistance. It is recommended that all students complete an application. Aid is awarded according to the amount of funds available and the degree of need. Awards will be mailed upon acceptance to Notre Dame High School. In the year 2007 224 students applied for assistance. 85% received awards between \$500 and \$2,000 from the Brothers of the Holy Cross, the Notre Dame Loyalty and Endowment Corporation, and other sources. Total aid awarded was \$ 405,000. 57 freshmen received financial help in the 2007-08 school year. In addition, some of the Loyalty and Endowment awards are scholarships awarded based on specific criteria: grade point average, class in school, son of an alumnus, and participation in activities. All financial aid applications are due **November 2nd**.
